The National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) released its Climate Strategy 2030 on Earth Day to help India get the green money it needs.

Big Films Media and Sam Bhattacharjee's "IRAH" is slated to premiere in theaters across the country on April 4, 2024, according to Iamplex Digital Theatrical Distribution. Performer and composer Sameer Sen was in attendance.

Investigating AI's Shadow Side

The "IRAH" teaser shows the shadowy side of AI, showing how it can be used inappropriately and have disastrous consequences.

The film's release date—April 5, 2024—coincides with Rohit Bose Roy's birthday—the 5th of April—and he has stated his enthusiasm for the project, in which he plays a crucial role.

India's First Multi-Purpose Green Hydrogen Pilot Project Inaugurated in Himachal Pradesh

India has taken a big step forward in renewable energy with the start of its first green hydrogen trial project.

It will be located at the 1,500 MW Nathpa Jhakri Hydro Power Station (NJHPS) in Jhakri, Himachal Pradesh.

The project, which is being led by Satluj Jal Vidyut Nigam (SJVN), wants to make green hydrogen using clean energy sources.

A Look at the Project

A 20Nm3/hr electrolyzer and a 25kW fuel cell capacity-based green hydrogen pilot plant are part of the project.











It is the first green hydrogen generation plant in the country that can be used for more than one thing. It makes energy and coats NJHPS's high-velocity oxygen fuel (HVOF).

Using renewable energy sources

The project uses clean energy from SJVN's 1.31 MW solar power plant in Wadhal, Himachal Pradesh, and an alkaline electrolyzer to separate water into hydrogen and oxygen. With this integration, hydrogen generation can go on for a long time.

22 New Products Added to Geographical Indication (GI) Registry

In March 2024, the Geographical Indication (GI) registry of India added 22 new products from the states of Assam, Uttar Pradesh, Tripura, and Meghalaya. These products are now protected under the GI tag, which recognizes their unique qualities and geographical origin.

It is among the world's oldest solar observatories, having been in operation since 1899, and has spent more than 125 years at the forefront of solar study. Now celebrating 125 years of operation, the observatory is run by the Indian Institute of

Astrophysics (IIA), Bengaluru.

Past Events

After the Great Drought of 1876–1878, in the late 19th century, India realized it needed a solar observatory. In 1792, the British East India Company founded the Madras Observatory to record astronomical observations.

However, to investigate the connection between solar activity and India's monsoon patterns, a separate solar observatory was considered necessary.

Adani's Vizhinjam Port Approved as India's First Transshipment Hub

Vizhinjam Port, which is owned and operated by Adani Group and is located in Kerala, has been granted permission by the government to function as India's first transshipment port. This designation is crucial because it makes it possible for cargo to be transported from larger vessels to smaller ones, which contributes to India's ambition of becoming a manufacturing hub at the international level.











Ports located outside of India, such as those in Colombo and Singapore, are currently responsible for the handling of a significant amount of India's transshipment goods. Particularly noteworthy is the approval of the government for transshipment operations. It is a significant achievement for India's marine industry that the Ministry has given its approval for Adani's Vizhinjam Port to operate as a transshipment center.

This approval must be granted to develop customs facilities at the port, which will ultimately result in more efficient operations.

VSHORAD: Indian Army Develops Indigenous Shoulder-Fired Missiles

The Indian Army is working on two projects worth more than Rs 6,800 crore to make Very Short Range Air Defence (VSHORAD) weapons in India.

These shoulder-fired missile systems are being made to protect against air threats along the borders with Pakistan and China.

Through these local routes, the Army hopes to get more than 500 launchers and about 3,000 missiles.











VSHORADS Project: Laser Beam Riding

- The first project, worth Rs 4,800 crore, is to make a VSHORADS that can ride on a laser beam.
- This project is being worked on by a defence Public Sector Undertaking (PSU) in Hyderabad and a private sector company in Pune.
- Drones, fighting planes, and helicopters from the enemy will not be able to get through the system.
- The Army will be in charge of this project, and the Indian Air Force will also get some of the 1,200 missiles and 200 launchers that are being made.

The Infra-Red Homing VSHORADS from DRDO

- The second project is being worked on by the Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO) to create a VSHORADS that uses infrared to find its way.
- This system is being made by DRDO and its partners in research and production, Adani Defence and I-Comm.
- The DRDO has already tried the system with a tripod and is now making it smaller so that it can be launched from the shoulder.

Indian Navy & UK's Royal Navy conduct a Joint Exercise

The Royal Fleet Auxiliary (RFA) Argus and Lyme Bay of the United Kingdom, along with the Indian Navy's INS Sahyadri, took part in a maritime exercise to increase maritime cooperation and interoperability.

To facilitate the sharing of best practices and knowledge between the two fleets, the exercises they participated in included tactical manoeuvres, boarding operations, and helicopter operations.

The rising bilateral defense cooperation between India and the United Kingdom is also brought to light by this.

India, Maldives & Sri Lanka's 'Dosti-16' Held in Maldives

According to Maldivian Defense Minister Mohamed Ghassan Maumoon, the troika will come together during the trilateral exercise 'Dosti' to tackle "shared maritime security concerns











through collaboration," emphasizing the significance of "collaboration and interoperability" among the coast guards personnel of the Maldives, India, and Sri Lanka.

Engagement and Goals

In the exercise "DOSTI-16," the Indian Coast Guard ships Samarth and Abhinav, the Sri Lankan Naval ship Samudura, and Bangladesh are all taking part, with the latter serving as observers.
